Manchester is supplied with a black, two-part polyurethane coating finish. This increases chip resistance and weathering characteristics, which is ideal for heavily trafficked areas.

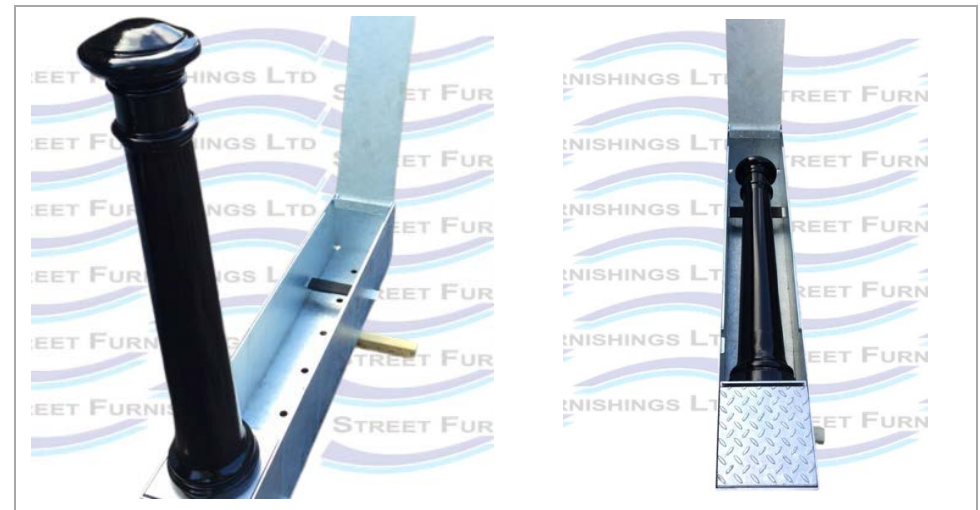

## Manchester Coffin Bollard

### Installation

#### 1) Siting

Ensure the bollards are installed where vehicles will cross over in a straight line at slow speed, avoid locations where vehicles will be manoeuvring or making tight turns to prevent the twisting motion over-stressing the lid pivot.

The bollards should be orientated so that the operator is protected from adjacent traffic and has sufficient working space when raising or lowering the bollards.

Avoid siting the bollards in hollows or low spots to reduce run-off water collection in the bollard 'coffin'.

#### 2) Installation

The bollard should be installed so that the lid is level and the area immediately around the bollard falls away to prevent excessive water ingress.

The overall depth and size of foundation will depend on local ground conditions, the type of vehicles driving over the bollard coffins and the volume /speed of the traffic.

The bollard coffins have drain holes to allow collected rain/run off water to drain away, provision must be made in the base for drainage by porous material directly under the centre section of the coffin or ducting/drainage below the drain holes

During installation care must be taken to prevent concrete etc. from entering the coffin box which may jam the bollard or lid pivot or prevent operation of the lock

Following installation the bollard should remain closed until the concrete has completely cured.

### 3) Maintenance

The bollard should be inspected to ensure that the coffin box is securely fixed and moving parts are free, the lid hinge and bollard pivot may be lubricated with grease, the lock mechanism should be lubricated with thin oil (WD-40 or similar)

The lid, lock and bollard can be replaced without excavating the coffin box, ensure that the retaining bolts securing the lid and bollard to the pivot bars are tight and secure.

The Manchester Bollard can be washed with soapy water if required. Solvents used to remove graffiti etc may cause discolouration to the surface but will not cause structural damage to the bollard.
